#### **OVER THE LAST 12 MONTHS WE HAVE..**



Improved the garage site at St Stephen Road with our environmental services team.



Promoted resident involvement opportunities including funding for individual tenants



We ran drop-in sessions at the Rees Centre Wellbeing Hub with our local policing team.



Worked with our local policing team to tackle anti-social behaviour



Carried out walkabouts to tackle untidy gardens.



### THOUGHTS ON YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD



Over the last 12 months the local housing team have been asking people in your neighbourhood about the area, what problems there are and the priorities for the future. Below are the specific issues raised and other information about the neighbourhood:

#### WHAT YOU TOLD US

- 89% of residents strongly agreed/ agreed that they felt safe and secure in their neighbourhood
- All those surveyed felt there is a strong sense of community, and that the neighbourhood is friendly
- Roads and parking are an issue for residents
- 94% of residents are either very happy or happy with outdoor spaces such as parks and green spaces
- 88% of residents said they were happy with the standard of cleanliness in their neighbourhood

### WHAT ARE **WE GOING TO DO?**

#### MAINTAIN AND INCREASE THE SENSE OF COMMUNITY

Why? Continue the sense of close-knit community When? 2023/2024 where people feel safe

**How?** Promote community projects and funding

#### PROMOTE CONSIDERATE PARKING

Why? Parking is an issue particularly in cul-de-sacs

**How?** We will work with the primary school, sheltered housing scheme and Plymouth City Council to send out clear messages including the impact of inconsiderate parking

#### IMPROVE LOCAL ROADS AND INFRASTRUCTURE

**Why?** Potholes are an issue for drivers and further assessment is required of dropped kerbs and the accessibility of pavements
